The **University of Calabria** offers scholarships for the ENROLLMENT OF INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS IN MASTER CAREERS

1. For each of its careers UNICAL allots 10% of the available enrollments to international students.  
The academic program for Master studies (Laurea Magistrale) and the enrollment procedure will be announced on the UNICAL website ([www.unicaladmission.it](http://www.unicaladmission.it)).
2. International students wishing to enroll must preregister in their Italian diplomatic representation. The time for that may vary in different countries, but usually starts around mid-May. This preregistration is compulsory, as well as a reasonable knowledge of Italian, in order to obtain a student Visa. In any case an intensive course of Italian language and culture (80 hours) is provided at UNICAL (free of charge).
3. Candidates should also preregister at UNICAL, following the indications available on the web page [www.unicaladmission.it](http://www.unicaladmission.it). This preregistration will allow UNICAL to carry a first evaluation of the acceptability of the enrolment application and of the possible grant application (see below). Thus preaccepted candidates may begin to study Italian sufficiently in advance to the Visa interview.
4. UNICAL preregistration requires the attachment of candidate's cv, list of exams taken, with the corresponding programs and marks.
5. In any case, after the acceptance of the online preregistration and receiving the Visa, accepted students must apply to UNICAL for the formal enrollment. The procedure, described under item 1, can be done online and its period is September/October of each year.



6. Currently the yearly fees are 650 euros.
7. This information is general, independently from a possible application for grants.

**Master grants for international students unical** has a scholarship program for Master (Laurea Magistrale) international students. Grants cover board and lodging at the Residential Centre of the University. The grants DO NOT cover other expenses such as travel, tuition fees, expenses for staying permit, health insurance etc. It is suggested that the students may count on a pocket money at least of 150 euros/month.

The application for the scholarship has to be filled online ([www.unicaladmission.it](http://www.unicaladmission.it)), indicating the career and providing the personal data requested. The grants are foreseen for two years. However, they can be extended to a third year, in order to complete the studies and the thesis work. Their renewal and possible extension require to have taken exams for at least 24 and 72 credits, out of the total of 120, for the two cases, respectively.

#### Special cases

1. If the student is enrolled in a double degree program the conditions for the grants and for the presentation of the application are those foreseen by the corresponding institutional agreement.
2. The same regulations apply in the case of exchange students within an institutional agreement.

The **University of Calabria** offers Summer Schools of Italian Language and Culture for foreign students during June/July 2015. The Summer School organises courses which will help you start a reflection on Italian language and culture through a thematic course of studies and will help you master listening and reading skills, as well as written and oral production competences. The humanistic approach adopted by our teaching staff, along with the use of authentic texts will be the key issues for learning activities in class. Seminars on Italian language and culture and on Italian cinema will be also offered, while a cooking laboratory will lead you through the typical flavours of the area.

At the end of the course a final test will assess your level of competence based on the European Common Framework of Reference for Languages (Council of Europe 2001) and a certificate stating the level of competence you have achieved will be issued by the University.

The course will take place at University of Calabria, one of the most breathtaking areas of Italy where you can admire the beauty of the landscapes (Sila Mountains, Tyrrhenian Sea) and enjoy some gorgeous sunsets on the sea at the end of lessons. Moreover, in the evening, you will have the opportunity to join the night life in downtown.

You can then join the course for:

- 3 weeks at the University Campus in Rende (province of Cosenza): 60 hours of tuition in class mainly devoted to the development of academic language skills and 20 hours of seminars.



Fee for three weeks tuition is € 1.850,00 and it includes:

- > lessons and seminars;
- > teaching material;
- > accommodation and full board in qualified accommodation;
- > daily bus transports;

3 excursions: along the north tyrrhenian coast, 2. To the Magna Graecia remains, 3. to the Natural Park of Sila Mountains. The Summer School will start first weeks of June and July 2015.

You will be asked a downpayment of 20% of the amount after receiving the communication of your enrolment in the course. Subsequently, we will provide you with a PW to access course details and to self-assess your level by taking an online placement test.

A minimum of 15 students is required to start the course.
