Courses & Content

Course 1 | **Study German in the Heart of Bavaria**

(100 hrs, excursions included)

Intensive German-Language Course (77 hrs)

Basic to lower intermediate level, focused on current issues of German culture with project work.

Conversation & Cultural Studies (2 levels, 23 hrs)

Everyday dialogues, role play, town rally, project work, individual and team work

Target Group, Language Requirements

Students and professionals with an interest and experience with German language and culture (basic and intermediate level).

Course 2 | **Art and Artists in German literature**

(100 hrs, excursions included)

Intensive German-Language Course (77 hrs)

Upper intermediate to advanced level, focused on current issues of German culture with project work.

Literature class (23 hrs)

What role does art play in literature, and how are the various arts dealt with in a literary form? These are the questions that our course on literature will try to answer. Using selected examples of German literary texts, we will jointly explore the traces left by music, art and literature in German poetry.

Target Group, Language Requirements

Students of German Studies and Humanities as well as prospective teachers of German as a second language (upper intermediate/advanced level).

Course 3 | **The Common European Market**

(117 hrs; excursions included)

Intensive German-Language Course (77 hrs)

Basic to lower intermediate level, focused on current issues of German culture with project work.

Political Science & Economics (40 hrs)

The Common European Market was not just a formal bureaucratic act, but the biggest peaceful integration of sovereign states into supranational institutions of all times. The creation of a common market introduces an extensive freedom of trade for goods and services as well as the free movement of people and capital. This course examines this extensive economic integration, its causes and its economic consequences. Students will learn to understand the essential driving forces behind European Integration. They will gain impressions of European macroeconomics and will be able to evaluate European developments.

Target Group, Language Requirements

Students of Political Science and Business as well as professionals in these disciplines with an advanced German level.
