WELCOME TO ORADEA

Nestled in the northwest of Romania, just near the Hungarian border, Oradea is one of the country's most charming and vibrant cities. Known for its stunning Art Nouveau architecture, rich history, and multicultural atmosphere, Oradea is often considered a hidden gem of Central Europe.

Oradea is:

- A university city, offering a dynamic and youthful atmosphere.
- Compact and walkable, yet modern and well-connected.
- A place of both historic beauty (with sights like the Black Eagle Palace, Oradea Fortress, and Union Square) and modern development (with thermal spas, shopping malls, and cafes).
- Known for its thermal baths and wellness centers, such as Băile Felix, a popular spot just outside the city.
- A safe and affordable place to live, making it ideal for students.

HOW TO GET TO ORADEA

By plane

- Oradea International Airport (OMR): The airport is located 6
 km southwest of the city centre
- Address: Calea Aradului 80,Oradea
- Website: www.AeroportOradea.ro
- From the airport to the city:
- Taxi/Bolt/Uber
- Local bus: Line 28 runs about every hour, but it doesn't operate 24/7.



By Train

• **Domestic routes:** Direct daily trains connect Oradea to Bucharest (~10–11h), Timișoara (~3h), etc.

International:

- At least five trains daily from Budapest to Oradea, the journey taking around 4 hours
- The Pannonia Express (Budapest → Bucharest) stops at Oradea along its route
- Pan-European trains like "Transilvania" Vienna-Oradea-Cluj operate via Vienna station partners.

Note: Some rail lines, especially Cluj-Oradea, have been under renovation. CFR has been running replacement buses for these stretches.

By Bus

Oradea is well-served by intercity bus lines from major
Romanian cities (Bucharest, Cluj, Sibiu, Timișoara, Arad, etc.)
and from Budapest. Private companies such as Rotexim,
FlixBus, Omega Group, Cotofana, and local coach operators
serve regular routes.

 From Budapest, buses are affordable and fairly frequent such as Rotexim, Flixbus, etc.

Alternative

• The Debrecen – Oradea route (~70 km) is partly equipped with cycling infrastructure and passes through rural areas. Some sections run on national roads with varying surface quality.

By car:

- From Budapest (Hungary): E60 or M3 \rightarrow M35 \rightarrow M4
 - \rightarrow Borş border \rightarrow A3 to Oradea road est.
- From Cluj-Napoca: E60 / DN1 road west.
- From Timișoara: DN79 road northeast.
- From Bucharest: A3 motorway (partially finished) + E60 / DN1 westbound.







DORMITORY

The University of Oradea offers accommodation to Erasmus students in dedicated dormitory facilities, with a total capacity of 1,435 places. If you applied for a place in a student dormitory, you will be informed before arrival about your assigned dorm.

Rent an apartment

ROMANIAN GRADING SYSTEM IN ECTS



University of Oradea curricula are adapted to the European Higher Education Area (EHEA) and use the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS).

ECTS: WHAT IS IT?

The ECTS represents the workload and defined learning outcomes ("what the individual knows, understands, and can do") of a given course or programme. The workload is an estimation of the time the individual typically needs to complete all learning activities. Such as lectures, seminars, projects, practical work, and individual study are required to achieve the defined learning outcomes in formal learning environments.

One credit usually corresponds to 25 to 30 hours of work. 60 credits are the equivalent of a full year of study. 30 credits are the equivalent of a semester of study. In a standard academic year, 60 credits are divided into several smaller components (subjects). Each subject corresponds to a specified number of credits.

Credits are awarded when the student fulfils all the requirements to pass a particular subject, which means a passing grade at the partial and/or final exams for the course, and a passing grade at the seminar/ laboratory/ project/ internship work.

The list of credits obtained by the student is reported in the Transcript of Records issued by UO.

GRADING SYSTEM

The grades are integer values from 1 to 10, with the maximal value of 10 (the highest level of knowledge and skills) and the minimal level of 5 (a basic level of knowledge is required, covering the main topics taught) for passing the subject.

The Romanian Ministry of Education and Research recommends the following interpretation of each grade:

ACADEMIC CALENDAR

First semester:

 The first semester begins on the 1st of October and consists of 14 effective weeks of academic activities.
 The study period is interrupted by 2 weeks of holidays over Christmas.
 The winter exams begin at the end of January and last for 4 weeks.

Second semester:

 The second semester begins after one week of holiday, at the end of February, and lasts for 14 weeks as well.
 The second semester is interrupted by a one-week Easter holiday.
 The summer exams begin in June and last for 4 weeks.
 The autumn session takes place in September.

1. Before Arrival

- Nomination To begin the process, you need to be nominated by your sending (home) university.
- Application Send all required documents to the Erasmus Office via email.
- Acceptance You will receive a Letter of Confirmation from the Erasmus Office once accepted.

2. Upon Arrival

- First Day Register at the Erasmus Office (Main Campus, Building J)
- Practical Matters Settle into your accommodation.

3. During the Semester

- Academic Engagement Meet your departmental coordinator and attend your courses.
- Social Life Take part in Erasmus events and meet new people.

4. Before Leaving

 Last Day – Fill out the Certificate of Attendance at the Erasmus Office.


ERASMUS CORIENTATION PROGRAM
